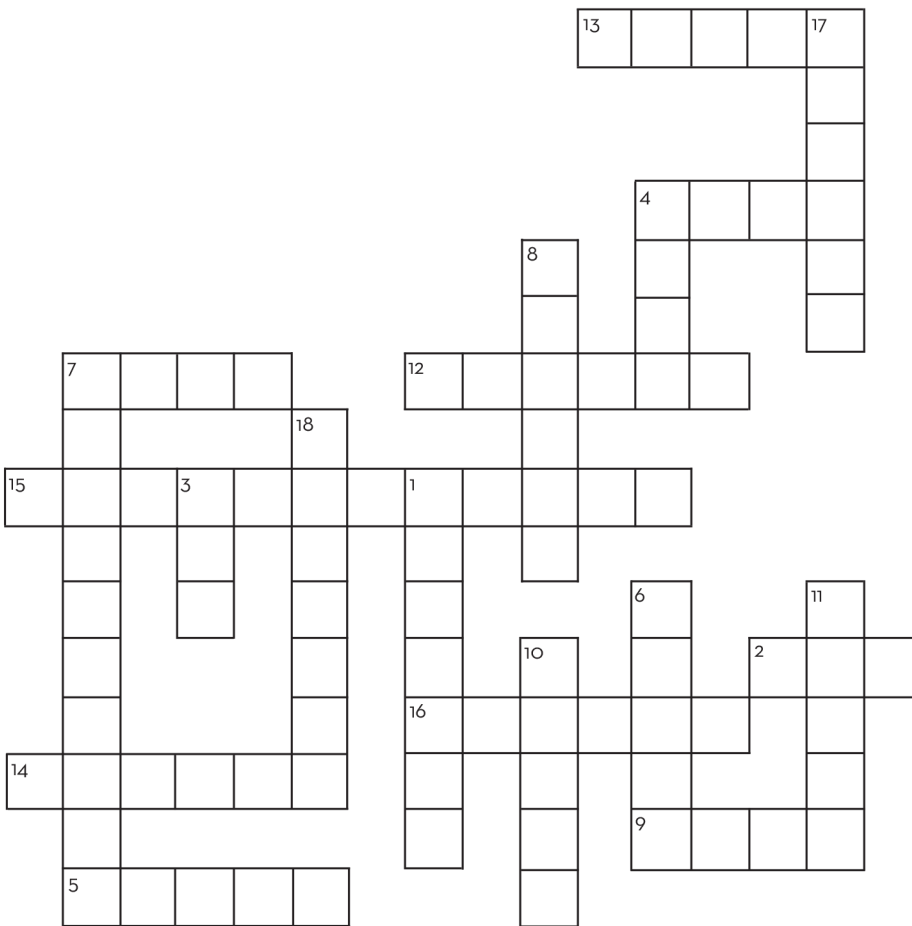




## ANIMALS IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

#### ACROSS

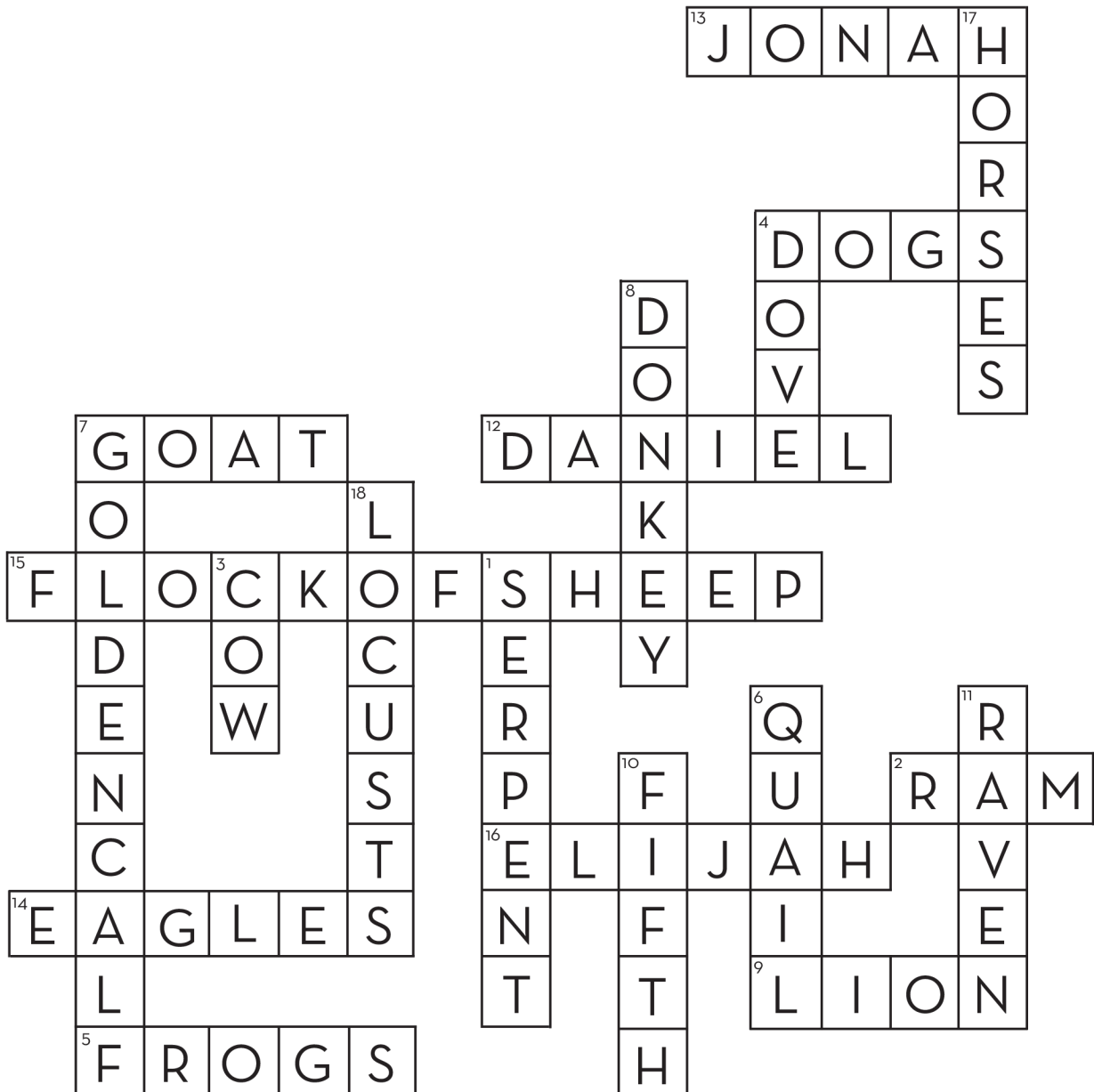
2. Instead of killing his son, Abraham sacrificed this animal (Genesis 22).

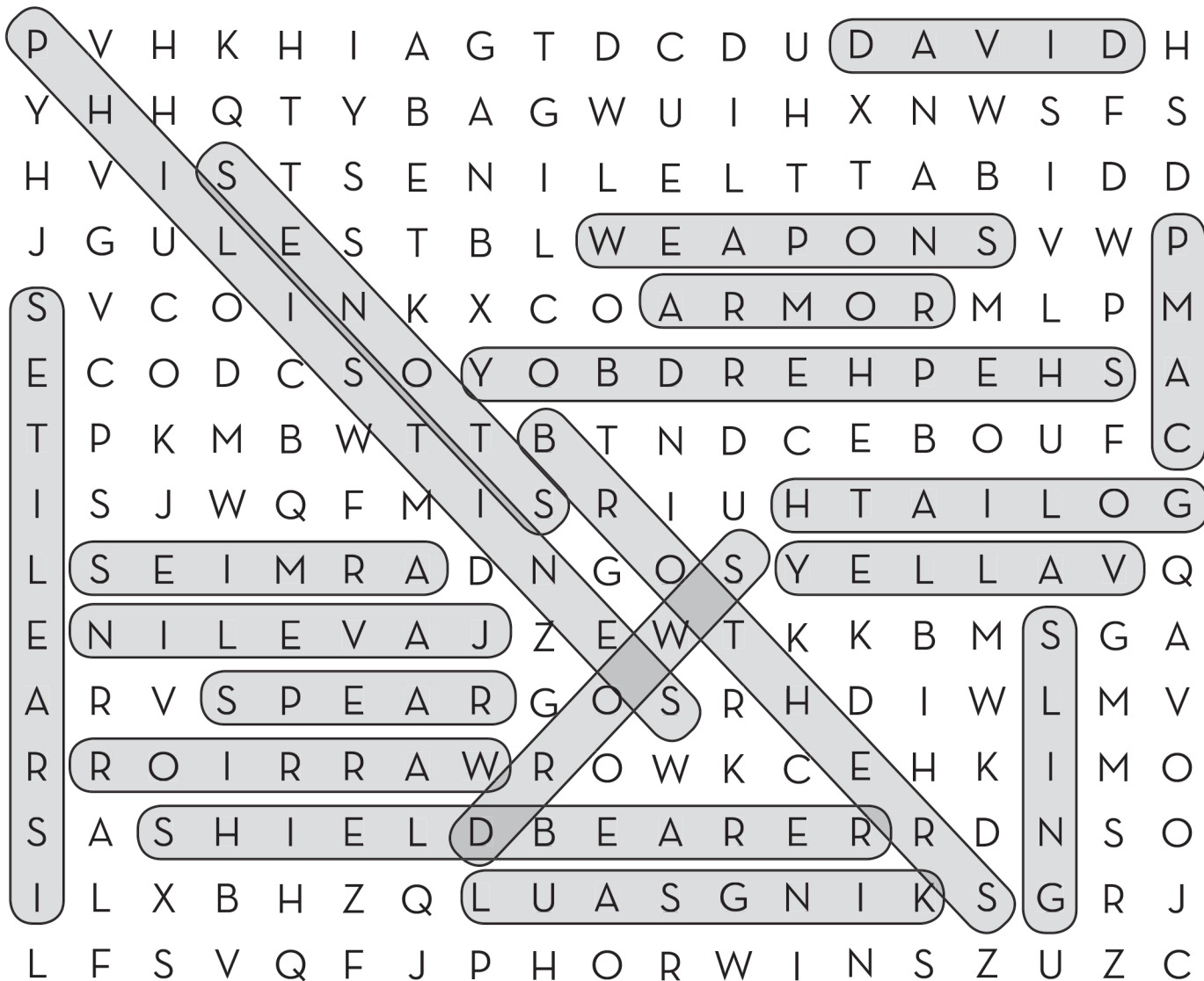

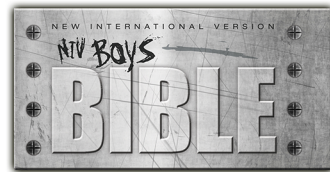

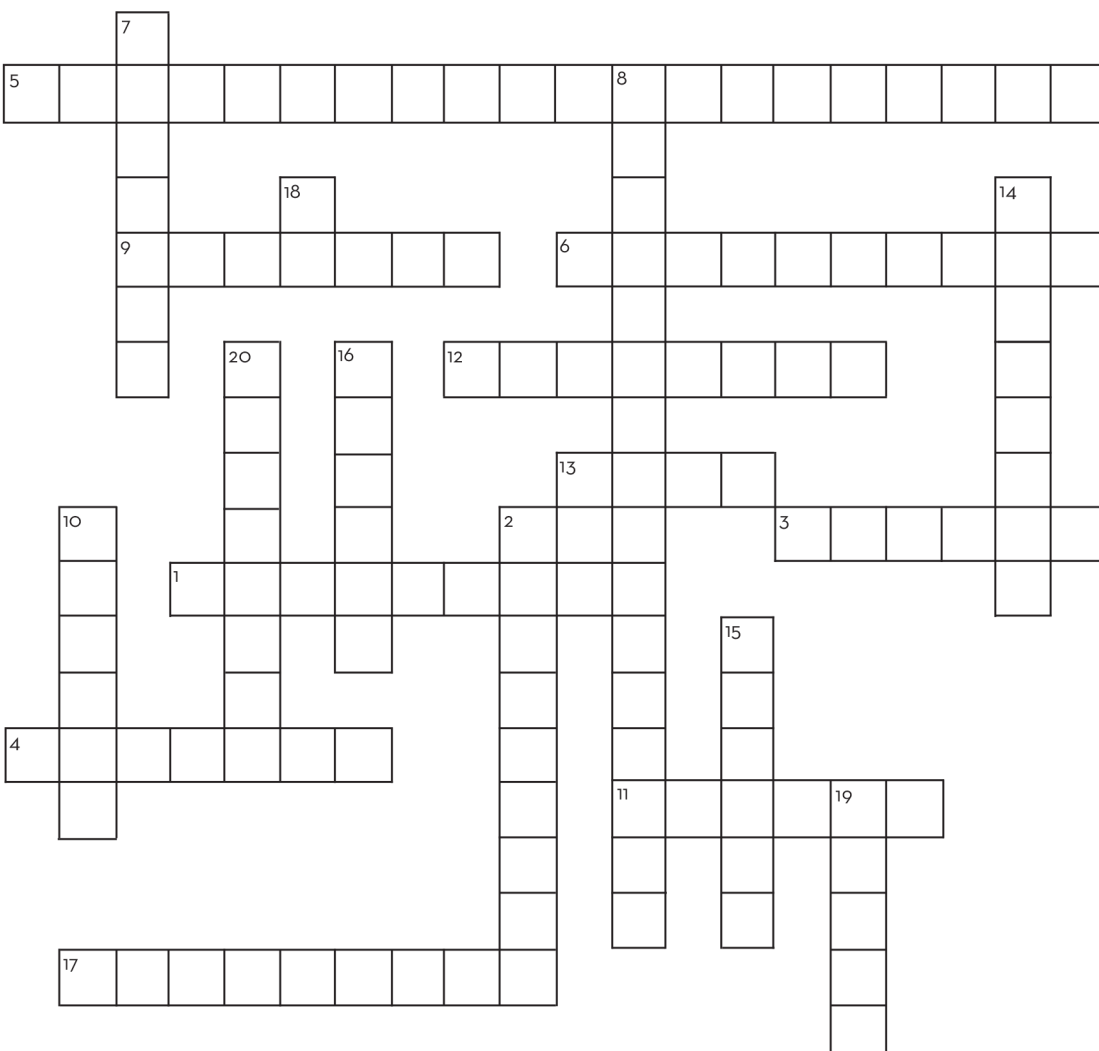
